- The teachers make the lessons fun e.g they use different voices in stories.

- We go over different skills more than once so that we can recall it at another time. We do this for basic skills too.
- Miss Bannister helps some of us each day to improve our reading.
- Nesy helps some of us improve our reading and spellings.
- Maths is interesting as we are taught different ways to solve problems.
- Recapping learning we have done before helps us to learn more.
- Post-it notes help us to overcome misunderstandings.

How do teachers and other grown-ups help you or your friends who find it difficult to learn?

Tell us how these children are helped in the school so that their learning improves

- The teacher uses things to help to scaffold our learning.
- We go out for small group interventions – these really help. – We ask the adults for help. They don't tell you the answer but guide you in the right direction.
- We practice things that we might find tricky.
- We have an English board and writing area which has word mats, dictionaries and things to support us.
- We have a reading area with ideas and recommendations.
- We have a maths board which reminds us of the key methods.
- We do basic skills in maths to support us with our recall.
- We have resource such as timetables grids to help us if we need them.
- We have an online safety board to help us to remember SMART rules.
- We have a board where we can write down things we need help on.
- We can use technology to help us.
- Using Nessy.
- We get asked further questions to reflect on our learning; it helps us to have another look.
- Our teacher works with different groups to help them.
- I like it when the lesson and the classroom set up means everyone can be involved and have a go at all the tasks.
- We have help mats to use in lessons.
- The teachers model what to do so that we can practice it.
- We have intervention which helps us learn.
- I like it when teachers encourage me.
- I like the small steps to success because it breaks down what I have to do.
- Repeated instructions really help me.
- We have a phonics mat and phonics board which help us.
- We're not given the answer but shown how to get there.
- Teachers help us to simplify a question.
