Dear parents/carers,

Keeping all children safe in school is of the highest priority at Christ Church. We frequently talk to the children about how they can keep safe in lots of different ways. However, we believe that it is important to check that the children are clear about the messages that we deliver and that they feel safe in school.

To obtain this information, we asked all of the children across the school a variety of different questions about safeguarding: do they know what things are in place to keep them safe at school and at home?

The answers the children gave are summarised below. It is fantastic to see that the children who attend Christ Church feel safe in school and they can tell us why. Their answers also show that they have a clear understanding of what actions they need to take to keep themselves safe and that they use their learning from school to help keep them safe online at home too.
