Painting

By the end of Year 6 the children should be able to explain what their style of painting is.

They will be able to use a wide range of techniques in their work including using water to affect the hue and transparency of their work.

They should be able to explain why they have chosen specific painting techniques.

Their sketchbooks will contain detailed notes, sketches and annotations. Combining graphics and text based research.

Textiles

This unit combines both visual and tactile elements. They will study the work of textile designer-**Cath Kidston**.



They will use their textile and sewing skills as part of a project, e.g. hanging, textile book. They will demonstrate running stitch, cross stitch, applique and or embroidery.

Key Vocabulary

Proportions-a part, share or number considered in comparative relation to a whole.

Scale-refers to the size of an object(a whole)in relationship to another object.

Hue-means colour

Transparency-in 2D design is simply the quality of being able to see through one or more layers in an artwork.
